



The Daughter Project is a God-inspired group home for adolescent girls who have been rescued from sex traffickers, and is designed to provide a safe place for them to live while receiving excellent, holistic recovery services. Our program was developed with a Christian worldview and uses well researched, best practices methods in every aspect of the functioning of the home. The Daughter Project House Moms, Mentors, medical service providers, college interns and volunteers all receive job-specific training. We provide care and supervision for our girls 24 hours a day. Our main objective is to help them begin their long journey of recovery from being trafficked and prepare them to return home or to be placed with a foster family. We do this in a holistic way by providing trauma counseling, spiritual guidance, health & nutrition education, life-skills training and formal schooling. These services are provided within a relationship-centered environment that encourages trust, respect and love.
